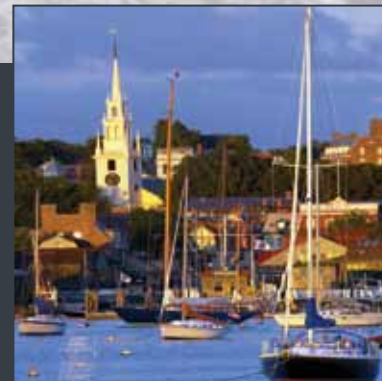

MARINE INFORMATION

SOUTH COURSE

For a front row seat to the action, the best views will be onshore. The AC 45 catamarans will be racing within yards of the shoreline of Fort Adams State Park. Towards the north end of Fort Adams, the Team Bases and America's Cup World Series Newport Sailing Village will have a ticketed entry and will feature play-by-play coverage broadcast over a giant screen. The shore side activities will also include interactive exhibits, a family Education and Exploration Zone, champagne, wine & beer gardens, merchandise, sailing opportunities, and a maritime festival. Spectators at Fort Adams will also be able to walk by all of the team compounds and watch the mammoth wing catamarans being hoisted in and out of the water off Sail Newport's Alofsin Piers. Because of the number of support boats involved in running the races – and a large safety zone – views from the water may be obstructed. Boaters are encouraged to dock at a marina, rent a mooring, or arrive via dinghy or tender in to one of the public dinghy docks available on Newport Harbor. Fort Adams is also accessible via water taxi from points in Newport and Jamestown to get the best seat in town. Tickets for the AC Village, parking, and water taxis are available online at www.americascup.com

The America's Cup World Series is a circuit of regattas, bringing Cup racing to the world's top sailing venues. The Newport event will be the last stop of the 2011-12 world tour, where the first world champion will be crowned. The racing will include match and fleet racing, as well as speed trials.

Spectator Boats

While spectator boats may watch the action from the water, the vast number of race and support vessels may obscure official viewing from the water. In addition, due to the extreme performance of the AC45 catamarans, a USCG Safety Zone will be enforced. Cooperation with the following instructions is required in order to ensure your safety, and the safety of other vessels.

Race Area

Racing will take place in one of two areas, depending on wind direction and velocity. It is important to note that, while the Safety Zone is being enforced, the East Passage of Narragansett Bay will remain open to recreational boaters who wish to enter or exit the Bay via a small waterway corridor on the west side of the East Passage, adjacent to Conanicut Island. The East Passage will, however, be closed to commercial vessels from approximately 1300 to 1730 on race days. Vessels needing special consideration to enter or transit through the Safety Zone may contact the on-scene Coast Guard patrol commander on VHF Ch 16.

THE WEST PASSAGE WILL REMAIN OPEN.



Stake Boats

35-50-ft. sail boats bearing official America's Cup flags on their mast will mark the outline of the restricted area. As a default, Stake Boats will perimeter, and restrict, the full race area 1 hour prior to the race start. When the Race Committee feels confident in wind direction and course configuration Stake Boats will move in closer to the actual race course. The area along the western shore of Fort Adams will be closed at all times to vessels.



NORTH COURSE

Marshal Boats and Restrictions

A number of Marshal Boats displaying official America's Cup flags will be permitted to operate within the course. Please obey their instructions. To avoid wake at the race area the speed limit will be restricted to 5 knots, and no spectator boat may drop anchor anywhere near the course.

Official Boats

A number of team and officially sanctioned vessels, such as Media, TV, Rescue, VIP, and other boats will be permitted to operate within the race area. They will all display official America's Cup World Series Flags.

Safety and Emergencies

The captain is responsible for the safety and control of his/her boat & all persons on board; the conduct of his/her vessel in accordance with maritime law & good seamanship. Always obey the instruction of local maritime authorities and law enforcement.
